

REPORTED SPEECH


Reported speech is when we tell someone what another person said. To do this, we can use direct speech or indirect speech.

direct speech: 'I work in a bank,' said Daniel.

indirect speech: Daniel said that he worked in a bank.

In indirect speech, we often use a tense which is 'further back' in the past than the tense originally used. This is called 'BACKSHIFT'. We also may need to change other words that were used, for example pronouns.

BACKSHIFT



present simple \Rightarrow past simple
present continuous \Rightarrow past continuous
present perfect \Rightarrow past perfect
present perfect continuous \Rightarrow past perfect continuous

past simple \Rightarrow past perfect
past continuous \Rightarrow past perfect continuous
past perfect \blacksquare
past perfect continuous \blacksquare

future simple \Rightarrow future in the past simple
future continuous \Rightarrow future in the past continuous
future perfect \Rightarrow future in the past perfect
future perfect continuous \Rightarrow future in the past perfect continuous

will \Rightarrow would
would \blacksquare
can \Rightarrow could
could \blacksquare
shall \Rightarrow would
should \blacksquare
must \Rightarrow must/had to
might \blacksquare

\blacksquare - does not change

NO BACKSHIFT

If what the speaker has said is still true or relevant, it's not always necessary to change the tense. This might happen when the speaker has used a present tense.

"I go to the gym next to your house."

Jenny told me that she goes to the gym next to my house. I'm thinking about going with her.

"I'm working in Italy for the next six months."

He told me he's working in Italy for the next six months. Maybe I should visit him!

"I've broken my arm!"

She said she's broken her arm, so she won't be at work this week.

PRONOUNS

If you are the person or one of the people who spoke, then the pronouns don't change.

"I'm working on my thesis," I said.

I told her that I was working on my thesis.

"We want our jobs back!" we said.

We said that we wanted our jobs back.

DEMONSTRATIVES AND ADVERBS OF TIME AND PLACE

DIRECT ⇒ REPORTED

this ⇒ that

here ⇒ there

today ⇒ that day

these ⇒ those

now ⇒ then

yesterday ⇒ the day before

tomorrow ⇒ the next/following day

ago ⇒ before

! Change only if it is no longer accurate:

"This is my house."

He said **this** was his house. = You are currently in front of the house.

He said **that** was his house. = You are not currently in front of the house.

"We like it here."

She told me they like it **here**. = You are currently in the place they like.

She told me they like it **there**. = You are not in the place they like.

"I'm planning to do it today."

She told me she's planning to do it **today**. = It is currently still the same day.

She told me she was planning to do it **that day**. = It is not the same day any more.
